Introduction

This Privacy Policy describes the policies and procedures on the collection, use and disclosure of your information by CoLAB Project Implementation (Pty) Ltd (further on referred to as "CoLAB" or "we" or "us") when you use our services and website.

Personal information means any data relating to an individual who can be identified, directly or indirectly, based on that information. This may include information such as names, contact details, identification data, online identifiers, or other characteristics specific to that individual.

This Privacy & Cookie Notice applies when you visit our website, blog, solutions and other services, including the CoLAB Talent Portal, events and social media pages, that refer or display a link to this website and/or notice. This Privacy Policy & Cookie Notice may be supplemented or replaced by additional privacy statements or terms provided to you.

By using this website and our services, you agree to the collection and use of information in accordance with this Privacy Policy.

1. Interpretation and Definitions

Interpretation

The words of which the first letter is capitalized have meanings defined under the following conditions. The following definitions shall have the same meaning regardless of whether they appear in singular or in plural.

Definitions

For the purposes of this Privacy Policy:

- Company (referred to as either "the Company", "We", "Us" or "Our" in this Agreement) refers to CoLAB Project Implementation (Pty) Ltd, 19 Sharrow Street, Boskruin, Randburg, 2188.
- Cookies are small files that are placed on Your computer, mobile device or any other
 device by a website, containing the details of Your browsing history on that website
 among its many uses.
- Country refers to: South Africa
- **Device** means any device that can access the Website or Service such as a computer, a mobile phone or a digital tablet.
- **Personal Data** is any information that relates to an identified or identifiable individual.

- Service refers to the Website, including Portals and Landing Pages.
- Service Provider means any natural or legal person who processes the data on behalf of the Company. It may refer to third-party companies or individuals employed by the Company to facilitate the Service, to provide the Service on behalf of the Company, to perform services related to the Service or to assist the Company in analysing how the Service is used.
- **Usage Data** refers to data collected automatically, either generated by the use of the Service or from the Service infrastructure itself (for example, the duration of a page visit).

- You means the individual accessing or using the Service, or the company, or other legal entity on behalf of which such individual is accessing or using the Service, as applicable.

2. Collecting and Using Your Personal Data

We generally process the personal information listed below, if applicable in the circumstances, and retain it as part of our records. Other personal information may be collected and processed if it is required in the circumstances.

2.1 Types of Data Collected

Personal Data

Tracking Technologies and Cookies

We use Cookies and similar tracking technologies to track the activity on Our Service and store certain information. Tracking technologies used are beacons, tags, and scripts to collect and track information and to improve and analyse Our Service. The technologies We use may include:

- Cookies or Browser Cookies. A cookie is a small file placed on Your Device. You can
 instruct Your browser to refuse all Cookies or to indicate when a Cookie is being
 sent. However, if You do not accept Cookies, You may not be able to use some parts
 of our Service. Unless you have adjusted Your browser setting so that it will refuse
 Cookies, our Service may use Cookies.

Necessary / Essential Cookies

Type: Session Cookies

Administered by: Us

Purpose: These Cookies are essential to provide You with services available through the Website and to enable You to use some of its features. They help to authenticate users and prevent fraudulent use of user accounts. Without these Cookies, the services that You have asked for cannot be provided, and We only use these Cookies to provide You with those services.

Functionality Cookies

Type: Persistent Cookies

Administered by: Us

Purpose: These Cookies allow us to remember choices You make when You use the Website, such as remembering your login details or language preference. The purpose of these Cookies is to provide You with a more personal experience and to avoid You having to reenter your preferences every time You use the Website.

2.2 Use of Your Personal Data

The Company may use Personal Data for the following purposes:

- To provide and maintain our Service, including to monitor the usage of our Service.

 regarding updates or informative communications related to the functionalities,
 products or contracted services, including the security updates, when necessary or
 reasonable for their implementation.
- To manage Your requests: To attend and manage Your requests to Us.
- For business transfers: We may use Your information to evaluate or conduct a
 merger, divestiture, restructuring, reorganization, dissolution, or other sale or
 transfer of some or all of Our assets, whether as a going concern or as part of
 bankruptcy, liquidation, or similar proceeding, in which Personal Data held by Us
 about our Service users is among the assets transferred.
- **For other purposes**: We may use Your information for other purposes, such as data analysis, and identifying usage trends.

2.3 Retention of Your Personal Data

The Company will retain Your Personal Data only for as long as is necessary for the purposes set out in this Privacy Policy. We will retain and use Your Personal Data to the extent necessary to comply with our legal obligations (for example, if we are required to retain your data to comply with applicable laws), resolve disputes, and enforce our legal agreements and policies.

The Company will also retain Usage Data for internal analysis purposes. Usage Data is generally retained for a shorter period of time, except when this data is used to strengthen the security or to improve the functionality of Our Service, or We are legally obligated to retain this data for longer time periods.

2.4 Transfer of Your Personal Data

Your information, including Personal Data, is processed at the Company's operating offices and in any other places where the parties involved in the processing are located. It means that this information may be transferred to — and maintained on — computers located outside of Your state, province, country or other governmental jurisdiction where the data protection laws may differ from those from Your jurisdiction.

Your consent to this Privacy Policy followed by Your submission of such information represents Your agreement to that transfer.

The Company will take all steps reasonably necessary to ensure that Your data is treated securely and in accordance with this Privacy Policy and no transfer of Your Personal Data will take place to an organization or a country unless there are adequate controls in place including the security of Your data and other personal information.

2.5 Disclosure of Your Personal Data

We may share relevant personal information about you with the persons and entities specified below, if it is necessary and lawful in the circumstances.

- Banks;
- Debt collectors / attorneys / credit bureaus;
- Our insurers;
- Our professional and legal advisers, including our accountants / auditors;
- Law enforcement structures, including courts and tribunals;
- We may share or transfer Your personal information in connection with, or during negotiations of, any merger, sale of Company assets, financing, or acquisition of all or a portion of Our business to another company.
- **With Your consent**: We may disclose Your personal information for any other purpose with Your consent.

Other legal requirements

The Company may disclose Your Personal Data in the good faith belief that such action is necessary to:

- Comply with a legal obligation
- Protect and defend the rights or property of the Company
- Prevent or investigate possible wrongdoing in connection with the Service
- Protect the personal safety of Users of the Service or the public
- Protect against legal liability

2.6 Security of Your Personal Data

The security of Your Personal Data is important to Us, but remember that no method of transmission over the Internet, or method of electronic storage is 100% secure. While We

strive to use commercially acceptable means to protect Your Personal Data, We cannot guarantee its absolute security.

3. Consent
